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


## Mighty Mining

- ASX listed holding company
- Mandated to increase investment / explore for new opportunities across sub-Saharan Africa
- New entity in each country to undertake operations
- Entering highly regulated sector in Africa
- In various phases (exploration, development and production) in various jurisdictions







## Mighty Mining



#### What were the challenges for Mighty Mining

#### **Exploration**


- Acquired exploration licences
- · Commenced initial exploration without community consultation
- · Artisanal miners refused access midway through exploration programme
- Police involved, shut down activities, requested payments for security services

#### **Development**

- Undertook feasibility study with certain water requirements
- Assumed access to local aquifer
- Local community aided by NGO lodged objection to development proposal
- Development funders pulled support as approvals delayed

**Production** 

- Failure to provide support tangible benefits to local community
- Did not use local suppliers when available
- Community blocked transport of product
- Government threatened to pull mining licences







## Mighty Mining



#### What were the practicalities for Mighty Mining

#### **Exploration**

- Entitlement mentality drove Government Approvals process which eroded corporate reputation
- Failed to keep records of engagements and efforts to find local partners

#### **Development**

- Development Plan approved by Government not well understood by implementing agencies constant battles with Agencies and Ministers resulting in suspension of Work Permits
- International Regulatory Authorities investigate "compliance" issues


#### **Production**

- Local Lobby groups influence Government and push Local Content Policy into Law Mighty Mining is always playing "Catch Up"
- Government temporarily suspends Mighty Mining's Operations due to non-compliance with the new Law


# DATA INTEGRITY TO CORPORATE INTEGRITY SUPPORTING SOCIAL LICENCE WITH TECH



- Controlling the controllable
- The discerning network of stakeholders
- Legitimacy through engagement & transparency
- Credibility through consistency & accountability
- Trust through partnerships
- Accuracy and responsiveness



- Integrated systems and processes → integrated messaging
- Elimination of information silos
- Cost and risk reduction
- Data 'value-adds' present opportunities for collaboration
- Employees empowered to act with integrity
- A tangible pathway to the intangible social license



## **CASE STUDY**

## Mighty Mining



#### What were the practicalities for Mighty Mining

#### **Exploration**

- Decided to hire in a local consultant
- Local consultant requested funds for unspecified community liaison
- It was unclear what those activities were and delays continued

#### **Development**

- Funders agreed not to pull support if Mighty Mining could "get this under control"
- Mighty Mining recognised they needed an intelligent framework in which to work, but how to start?

#### **Production**

- Mighty Mining spent millions reviewing local content requirements and financing various local initiatives
- Left hand right hand, an environmental obligation was breached
- Despite significant CSR programmes, permit threatened to be cancelled

## **ACCOUNTING FOR INTANGIBLES**



# What is an intangible?

A controlled resource that lacks physical substance

# When is it recognised?

- Separable from the entity or arising from legal rights
- Probable that future economic benefits will arise
- Cost can be reliably measured
- Higher bar for internally generated assets vs purchased assets
- Special dispensation for exploration for resources

# How is it measured?

- Initially at cost (or initial fair value in a business combination)
- Can only be revalued if active market
- Depreciated over its useful life
- Subject to impairment assessment



## **RECOGNITION IN PRACTICE**

	Internally generated assets	Purchased intangibles	Acquired in a business combination
Separable/arise from legal rights	Often not met	Typically met	Key question – need to identify all assets
Probable that economic benefits will arise	Additional requirements so rarely met	Depends on nature	Always satisfied
Cost can be reliably measured	Can be challenging to capture	Nearly always met	Almost always
Proportion recognised	<5%	30% – 50% (can be part of other assets)	50 – 75% (Remainder in goodwill or resource)



## **APPLICATION TO 'LICENCE TO OPERATE'**


	Internally generated assets	Purchased intangibles	Acquired in a business combination
Examples	Training, donations, social engagement, government engagement	Social investments, marketing programs, sponsorships	Brand, mining licences, exploration rights
Separable/arise from legal rights	Typically no	Typically yes	Yes
Cost can be reliably measured	N/A	No direct benefits	Always met
Probable that economic benefits will arise	N/A	N/A	Often, otherwise goodwill
